Anti-Muslim racism is hurtful and can be a criminal offence in many cases.

On average, more than two documented anti-Muslim incidents take place in Germany everday. Anti-Muslim racism takes place in the workplace, at school, on the housing market or in public spaces and can manifest itself as discrimination, insults or in the form of violence. It is assumed that there are a serious number of unreported anti-Muslim incidents that have not yet been reported or recorded.

For example:

- if you are attacked, insulted or threatened on the street,
- if you are spat at / physically attacked on the way to the mosque,
- if you are discriminated against at work or when looking for accommodation,
- if you are treated unequally at school or in hospital because of your name, appearance, language and/or religion,
- damage to property, e.g. anti-Muslim graffiti in public spaces / at Islamic institutions

A racist comment that hurts you or makes you feel marginalised can also be an expression of anti-Muslim racism. Anti-Muslim racism manifests itself in many different ways.

T IS IMPORTANT TO REPORT YOUR INCIDENT AND/OR SEEK FREE COUNSELLING.

- It can help you to talk about and share your experience of racism. You become active!
- Other affected people are encouraged to share their experiences of racism.
 You motivate them through your report.
- You make anti-Muslim racism visible. Many affected people do not report incidents.
 With your report, your case is statistically recorded and the social problem becomes visible.

YES, THE INCIDENT IS BAD ENOUGH.

Racism is part of everyday life for many people. Anyone can report it. Even if you "only" have a bad feeling or if you don't know how to categorise something.
